

**Guaranteed Admissions Agreement  
Radford University  
and  
Virginia Community College System**

Radford University (RU) and the Virginia Community College System (VCCS), recognizing the need to facilitate the admission of transfer students from Virginia’s community colleges to RU as they pursue a baccalaureate degree in nursing, resolve to adopt a Guaranteed Admissions Agreement (GAA). The agreement provides a pathway for students to progress from the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing degree directly to the Registered Nurse – Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN-BSN) program at Radford University. VCCS students who do not meet the terms described herein may still apply and will be considered for admission, although admission is not guaranteed.

**Section I: General Admission Requirements and Eligibility**

To be guaranteed admission under this GAA, a VCCS student must:

1. Earn a VCCS associate of applied science (AAS) degree in Nursing.
2. Provide evidence of a current, unencumbered license to practice as a Registered Nurse (RN) in the U.S, and 6 months of nursing experience (full-time or part-time).
3. Provide evidence of current employment in a position that requires use of nursing knowledge and expertise at the time of application and enrollment.

Students meeting the above criteria are referred to as “GAA students.” GAA students will be given the same consideration as other students, including RU students, for registration, financial aid, and any other opportunities open to students with RN-BSN degree seeking standing. Students are admitted each fall. Full-time and part-time tracks are available.

**Section II: Program Pre-Requisites**

In addition, GAA students must complete the following program pre-requisites:

1. Earn at least a 2.50 grade point average (G.P.A.) on all nursing courses attempted. If courses are repeated, all grades earned in nursing courses will be counted when calculating the G.P.A..
2. Earn at least a 2.80 G.P.A. on all cumulative college work attempted or on the last twenty-four (24) credit hours attempted (includes VCCS courses and any courses completed at other postsecondary institutions)
3. Completed all but nine (9) or fewer credits of the core curriculum required for the BSN, as shown in Appendix 1. These courses may be completed as part of the AAS in Nursing. One course cannot be used to satisfy more than one core curriculum requirement. Appendix 2 outlines courses to be completed at RU.

No distinction will be made by RU regarding college courses applicable to the transfer associate degree that are taken through dual enrollment arrangements with high schools. In addition, credit for courses completed through International Baccalaureate, Advanced Placement, Cambridge, CLEP, and Armed Services experience will be accepted according to stated policies for acceptance of credit, which can be found in the RU catalog for the year the GAA student enters RU.

#### **Section IV: Responsibilities of the VCCS**

1. Disseminate accurate information to VCCS nursing program students regarding the general conditions of this agreement. This agreement will be posted on the VCCS website as well as the Virginia Education Wizard, an online college planning site utilized by VCCS students, faculty, and staff.
2. VCCS colleges will provide academic advising services to assist VCCS students in choosing courses that will best prepare them for entering the RN-BSN at RU.
3. Communicate with RU representatives to discuss changes in VCCS programs, which might impact or alter this agreement.
